You asked me for my comments on Jeffrey Archer's suggestions for Prime Ministerial meetings with Editors.

I agree that Sir David English should be invited to the occasional dinner or reception, as indeed he is. I am much less happy about Stewart Steven, Editor Mail on Sunday, who is not my cup of tea as a journalist and is putting his paper behind the SDP. On the other hand, he might merit stroking, but in his case I would suggest a reception rather than a dinner.

Gordon Greig and Robin Oakley have the normal access of members of the Lobby to the Prime Minister and I do not think they should be singled out for particular access. One of the great strengths of this Government is that it has not, at working level, operated what used to be called a "White Commonwealth", and I do hope Mr Archer does not want to start one now.
