CRIME PREVENTION SEMINAR

This seminar is to be held on Wednesday 8 January, and you expressed a preference for it to begin at 1630, last for two hours, and be followed by drinks.

The Home Office, in consultation with other departments, have now approved a draft guest list. The list includes representatives from the police, insurance industry, the CBI, security industry, health authorities, retailers, car manufacturers, architects, builders, the electricity council, and the gas board among others. The list includes people from Scotland and Wales though not yet from Northern Ireland. The total number of outsiders proposed amounts to 43. In addition, there would be perhaps 10 Ministers and <sup>their</sup> officials from the key departments concerned: Home Office, DES, Energy, Scottish Office, Welsh Office, DHSS, DTI, Transport, Environment, Northern Ireland Office and Employment. Michael Alison and perhaps one or two appropriate MPs in addition to John Wheeler should also be invited. The total number of attending would amount to about 70.

The Prime Minister is therefore keen to gather together representatives from key organisations to discuss how they can help carry forward crime prevention in the community, and she hopes that the meeting will be able to agree an action plan and timetable for achieving clear targets.
