I thought the best course would be to make a separate presentation to the Home Office so that they would be aware of the developments which have taken place. This we propose to do during the course of the next few weeks.

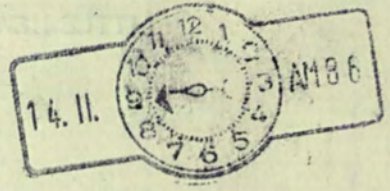
I will be looking forward to the follow up meeting.
