Started as a Page Boy at the Strand Palace Hotel, Later on he was transferred to the Cumberland Hotel as Restaurant Manager, then was transferred to the Trocadero Grill Room. Stayed there five years, then transferred to the Outdoor Catering Department of J. Lyons & Company Limited as Special Functions Manager, dealing with functions such as the Wimbledon Tennis Championships, Royal Garden Parties, Royal Windsor Horse Show, etc. So far he has been involved with 109 Garden Parties.

In November 1985 he was presented with the M.V.O. by Her Majesty The Queen.

During the war he served 2 years in Freetown, Sierra Leone, West Africa as Gunnery Sergeant. Returned home in 1942 for O.J.C. in Wales then transferred to the Sussex Regiment, wounded at Bayoeur, hospitalised in Birmingham. In 1943 he was transferred to the 2nd Seaford Highlanders, fought in the Reichwald Forest, eventually crossed the Rhine with Montgomery at Rees.
